Programmes for international students

CHE welcomes international students to join our university for a short exchange programme (3-5 months). We offer our professional, practical education to international students, and at the same time benefit from their different cultural views.

We organise various international programmes that are completely taught in English. These programmes are open for Erasmus+ students, free movers, people with other scholarships, Dutch students from CHE and Dutch students from other universities in the Netherlands. This way, we hope to welcome students from many different backgrounds, so that all students will learn a lot about intercultural communication, besides the topics of their own programmes and Dutch culture.

Most of our international programmes take 2,5 months each. International students have the possibility to combine two consecutive programmes, and stay for a full semester. On our website the duration of the course is mentioned, as well as the number of credits that can be obtained.

Application

International programmes are open for everyone who:

- / is eligible for or following Bachelor Education,
- / has a B2 proficiency level in English,
- / is max. 35 years old,
- / has good computer skills,
- / respects CHE's Christian values.

Grants and Scholarships

Erasmus+ students and other Exchange students

CHE participates in the European Commission's Erasmus+ Programme. Students from Universities that have an Inter Institutional Agreement with CHE, are welcome to join us via Erasmus+. Also students from institutions with which CHE has a Memorandum of Understanding, are welcome to join us as exchange students. All exchange students need to be nominated by their home institution first. After that, they need to apply personally via the application form on our website: www.CHE.nl/en



Free movers

If you are not studying at the moment, or if you are studying at an institution that does not have an agreement for exchange with our university, you can still study at our university, if you meet the application criteria. Student life
